Aga Khan/K'Cidade

K'CIDADE program is an Urban Community Development Programme sponsored by the Aga Khan Foundation, which aims to fight poverty and social exclusion in urban areas. The K'CIDADE is based on the premise that communities assert themselves as active agents of their own sustainable development which necessarily implies a shift from a welfare mentality to an approach based on the spirit of autonomy and sustainable development. Thus, the program aims to promote sustainable local development initiatives, focusing on participation and empowerment of communities integrating a long-term approach, empowerment, sustainability, participation and monitoring and evaluation

Tamera

TAMERA is a School and Research Station for Realistic Utopia. The project was founded in Germany in 1978. In 1995 it moved to Portugal. Today 170 people live and work on a property of 330 acres. The founding thought was to develop a non-violent life model for cooperation between human being, animal and nature.

Rumo

RUMO is a Cooperative of Social Solidarity which seeks to promote inclusion in education, work and community, among disadvantaged people, from the perspective of the Supported Employment Movement. An integrated intervention is the key of Rumo's work, through projects and services, locally developed, and enhancing networking
